THE AUCKLAND WRITERS FESTIVAL, WITH THE GENEROUS SUPPORT OF FREEMASONS FOUNDATION, IS DELIGHTED TO DELIVER ITS 2022 SCHOOLS PROGRAMME HŌTAKA KURA, DESIGNED TO INSPIRE YOUNG WRITERS AND READERS.

This year we are offering four-session programmes for Years 5-6 (23 or 24 or 25 August), Years 7-8 (24 August) and Years 9-13 (23 or 25 August).

To assist schools to make the most of their Festival visit, and in partnership with the National Library, a set of teaching resources around key titles featured in the programme have been devised. Check them out on our website at: writersfestival.co.nz/schools/resources.

Day attendance (four x 45-minute sessions) is just \$12 per student; workshop places (one hour) are \$15 per student; and teachers attend free. Books are available for purchase at the Festival Bookshop and writers will be available to sign books in the breaks.

Funding to support travel costs is available to schools on application and assessed according to need. Further information is on page 4, and the application form is found on page 20.

Tickets **must be booked through schools**. Ticketing information, booking forms, Covid-19 Protection Framework information, and transport subsidy applications are included in this programme.

The Festival also continues our investment in youth education and literacy programmes with the addition of three new schools in our **Writing the Future** creative writing programme, taking to 18 the total number of schools which have had the opportunity to participate.

The Festival's Schools Programme (23-25 August) will only be presented if Auckland is at an Orange or Green Covid-19 Protection Framework setting at that time. Should the Festival have to be cancelled, all ticket monies will be refunded via Ticketmaster, with the exception of the \$11 booking fee levied by the ticketing agent.

ON THE DAY ATTENDANCE




WINGS OF FIRE

TUI T SUTHERLAND — LIVESTREAM IN VENUE

The popular Wings of Fire series from author **Tui T Sutherland** (whose mother was born in Aotearoa New Zealand) has been on the *New York Times* bestseller list for more than 148 weeks and sold over 14 million copies. BONKERS SHORT STORIES

TOM E MOFFATT

Award-winning funny man, **Tom E Moffatt**, writes laugh-out-loud stories brimming with mind-boggling characters and situations. He recently launched his third collection of Bonkers Short Stories, and has also written several chapter books and joke books, including *Barking Mad*, which won the Tom Fitzgibbon Award in 2016, and *You're Joking: Become an Expert Joke-Teller*, which was shortlisted for the 2021 Elsie Locke Award for Non-Fiction in the NZ Book Awards for Children and Young Adults. Prepare for a fun-filled session of larger-than-life stories that will get students hooked on reading for enjoyment.





REMARKABLE ANIMAL STORIES

MARIA GILL

Maria Gill's Remarkable Animal Stories is a fascinating collection of tales about entertaining and inspiring animals from 'down under', including Kahurangi the talking Kōkako and Charisma the double Olympic champion horse. The author of more than 60 books, Maria has received multiple Storylines Notable Book nominations, won the Elsie Locke Award for Non-Fiction and the Margaret Mahy Book of the Year, and in 2020 was awarded the Margaret Mahy Medal for her distinguished contribution to New Zealand children's literature. She shares some of her favourite stories from the collection and talks about what makes them so compelling.





CHARLIE TANGAROA AND THE CREATURE FROM THE SEA

TK ROXBOROGH

2021 NZ Book Awards for Children and Young Adults supreme winner **Tania Roxborogh** (Ngāti Porou) scooped up both the Wright Family Foundation Esther Glen Junior Fiction Award and the coveted Margaret Mahy Book of the Year award for her book *Charlie Tangaroa and the Creature from the Sea*. It is a tale of the interconnection of humans and the environment, interweaving ordinary Tolaga Bay family life with Māori mythology, and has been praised for the diversity of its characters as well as its engaging style and voice. Tania will talk about her winning modern-day tale and the ancient stories from which it and other recent books have been shaped. KWAME ALEXANDER — LIVESTREAM IN VENUE

Charismatic and innovative poet and educator **Kwame Alexander** is the New York Times bestselling author of 36 books including Newbery Medal winning verse novel The Crossover, Caldecott Medal Book The Undefeated, and Carnegie Medal shortlisted Rebound. He is also the co-author, with James Patterson, of Becoming Muhammad Ali. Known for his rhythmic writing, he is dedicated to 'changing the world one word at a time' with relatable work that develops a love of reading, like his new Disney+ TV series based on *The Crossover*. GIFTED CLANS

GRACI KIM

Korean-Kiwi Graci Kim's The Last Fallen Starlaunched in the US in 2021 under Rick Riordan's Disney imprint and is the first of a mythology-inspired Gifted Clans trilogy, with the second book The Last Fallen Moon, due in June 2022. The bestselling book has garnered a host of accolades including being named as an Indigo Best Book of 2021, an Amazon Editors' Pick for Best Book Ages 9-12, a 2021 Goodreads Choice Award nominee, and has been optioned for a live-action television series. Graci will introduce some of the Korean traditions and lore at the heart of her adventure series, and talk about the power of curiosity, creativity, and play.









SPARK HUNTER

SONYA WILSON

Debut novelist **Sonya Wilson's** epic adventure *Spark Hunter* is set within a million hectares of bush-clad land in the forests of Fiordland National Park. Praised for beautifully capturing the taonga of Pātea Doubtful Sound and Tamatea Dusky Sound, where the mysteries of flora and fauna collide, the survivalist story follows young hunter, Nissa, as she tries to track down the source of mysterious lights spotted in the dangerous wonderland. Sonya is a broadcast journalist and has worked on a number of TVNZ news and current affairs programmes. A self-confessed 'nature nerd', she will reveal how her own childhood adventures in the remarkable landscape of the south inspired this book.

THE THAUMAGICIAN'S REVENGE

GARETH WARD

Award-winning author and sometime magician Gareth Ward (aka The Great Wardini) is known for conjuring up dramatic steampunk adventures. His debut novel The Traitor and the Thiefwon the 2016 Storylines Tessa Duder Award and the 2018 Sir Julius Vogel Award for Best Youth Novel and Best New Talent. The thrills have continued with The Clockill and the Thief, and his latest The Thaumagician's Revenge in which humans with unusual abilities, known as "aberrations", attempt to prevent the old gods returning to the world. Gareth brings a winning combination of magical tricks and tales to the stage to inspire young readers.






